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Supervisor Sudan's Report

- I was invited to meet with EPA Region 2 Administrator Judith Enck, Mayor Borge and a few others prior to the meeting at HFCS to discuss the PFOA issue.
- Attended the Healthy Hoosick Water sponsored public information session held at HFCS. This was a very informative meeting for everyone.
- Attended Hoosick Rising steering committee meeting. We are not ready to give up....
- Met with Bill Shiland & Kaila Matatt to discuss pool operations for the 2017 year.
- Attended Hoosick Rising meeting at Parsons Corner. Approximately 30 people were there including the entire Town Board to take a tour of the new building and to discuss the future of Hoosick and the surrounding area.
- After months of prodding by Mayor Borge through the Governor's Office, he, I and School Superintendent Facin were invited to attend a meeting in Albany with Governor Cuomo and others to discuss the PFOA contamination. It was a very good meeting with some give and take. We covered a lot of information in a short amount of time, most of which has been reported. I believe the actions that were taken that day will help to expedite the processes that will need to be put into place to help our community deal with and ultimately move past this contamination issue.
- Held a community Solar Workshop session.
- Tony Rice, Bill Shiland and I met with Albrecht & Wilson Land Surveyors, to review boundary line changes in area around the community pool.
- I met with NYS DOH officials as they set up in the Armory's Perry Room to begin Information Sessions.
- Attended the Solar Committee Meeting.
- Mayor Borge and I met with County Executive Kathy Jimino and County Legislative Chairman Stan Brownell to discuss the PFOA contamination issue.
- I was invited, and attended a meeting at the Village water treatment plant with Congressman Chris Gibson, Assemblyman Steve McLaughlin, County Legislative Chairman Stan Brownell, Deputy County Executive Chris Meyer, Mayor Borge, Ed Canning from St. Gobain and others to see the progress being made so far and to continue to discuss the PFOA contamination issue.

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Old and Ongoing Business

- Boundary Line Adjustment Update- Castle Playground Project- The field work has been completed. Tony Rice, Bill Shiland & I met with the surveyors to review where property lines should be. As a part of that meeting we questioned if the easement granted to Laporte's by the Town a few years ago may be all that the state would require for that section of the boundary line issue. We will contact the state for clarification.
- **Castle Playground Project-** Kiwanis, working with our highway dept. has removed large sections of the old wooden structures and the old swing set. The order for the new equipment has been placed. We expect delivery of the new equipment in very early spring.
- **Pool Project Bond Anticipation Note (BAN)** The BAN payment was made in January as discussed last month. We have a new BAN on the remaining balance of \$420,000 with Pioneer Savings who was the low bidder @ 1.30% per annum, is payable at maturity, and matures on January 25th 2017.
- **Pool Project Phase Two-** We have received a Professional Services Outline from LaBerge to continue to work with us on updating the Pump House & Bath House at the Weir Reynolds Community Swimming Pool. The Project Budget from LaBerge is \$48,000-\$66,000. As a reminder the CFG through NYS Parks and Recreation is for \$123,625. The match from the Town of Hoosick is the same for a total of \$247,250.
 - Motion- to approve the Professional Services Outline from LaBerge Engineering for Parks Grant CFA# 149046 (Pool Improvements).
 Hyde made the motion to approve, Sheffer seconded. All ayes carried.
- Well Water Testing- We have been working with NYS Dept. of Health on testing private wells for PFOA's in the area. The results are in from the samples taken in November. NYSDOH has taken many more samples in the past few weeks and they continue to update a map that they have developed showing the areas of concern. To see the map go to the Village Web Site @ www.villageofhoosickfalls.com, on the right side of the page is a link to the Hoosick Falls Water Website; from here you can find the map, public test results, the latest news and information pertaining to this situation. The NYSDOH Well Testing Plan is to start near St. Gobain and work out from there. With approx. 1,900 wells in the Town of Hoosick it will take some time. Al Demarco from NYSDOH is coordinating the well testing. He can be reached at 518-402-7860.
