# Superintendent of Highway's Report

- Fog Hill Road-Ditching will be done on the road. The roads have a crown on them. Adjustments have been made for the water flow. Bill went over when it rained to make sure that the work completed worked. Issue is fixed for now. Bill states that the driveway is steep so that may have to be addressed.
- Cemetery work is completed.
- Grader broke down and will be fixed. Still waiting on a part to be delivered.
- Bovie Hill is being worked on and hope to finish this soon.
- Finishing closing down the Town Pool. Water is drained from the pool and will do pumps next week.

#### Recreation

- **2019 Summer Camp & Community Pool Over** Camp is 60 children and there are plans to do training for the lifeguards and WSI before next summer. The board will be reviewing the report from this past summer and determining pricing for the upcoming budget.
- Town of Hoosick Recreation Web Site- this has been up and has not been updated in a while. Would need someone to update this. There is very minimal cost to the town for this this site.

# Supervisor Surdam's Report

- The Aug 21<sup>st</sup> meeting that I attended with Comp Alliance was just a review and confirmation that our workers comp coverage is all set with no expected changes. There was no additional information on the member loyalty award program rebate.
- I attended a Cyber Security Webinar offered by NYMIR.
- Union Contract Negotiations- I attended two meetings with the Union and held a Special Meeting with the Town Board to discuss proposals.
- I attended the Training class we held for the Planning, Zoning, and Town Boards. Nicole Allen & Matthew Rogers from the LaBerge Engineering Planning Dept. facilitated the training class. Nicole & Matthew are Professional Planners and Matthew had the added experience of being a Planning Board Chairman for the Town of Corinth. We covered a number of topics based on recent issues that are being experienced with new sub-divisions. We will use this training as a spring board to become better organized with clearer processes and guidelines. Our simple sub division law did come up again and we do take a closer look at that to determine if and how maybe to carve out commercial from the law. I thought this was a very productive 2 hours and look forward to working on providing better support to our Planning & Zoning Boards.
- I met out Summer Camp Manager Ashley St Onge to follow up on this year's program and to discuss needs/thoughts for next year.
- Tom Margiotta and I have continued to work with CHA on the pool splash pad, mechanical room and pavilion plans. We have received a finished copy of the plans and will need to set up a workshop to move forward with the project. I continue to Thank Tom for all of his help with this project and with helping me as the Pool Operator keeping our pool water crystal clear.
- I did attend the monthly PFOA conference call with NYSDEC, NYSDOH, EPA and Mayor Allen.

#### **Town Council Reports**

**Deputy Supervisor Sheffer-** Local Roads program is wrapping up for the summer. A detailed report will be available in a couple of weeks. Hoosick Rising met last week. They have a lot of activities coming up. Apple pie eating contest will be done at the same time as the Walter Woods tractor weekend. Christmas tree lighting will be coming back again this year. The island at 22 and 7 has been weeded for the most part. Jerry, Bill and Dave along with Eric did the weeding. There are still small weeds that need to be done but may use a spray to get rid of them. Eric attended CPWG meeting. DEC had a

presentation and DOH was on hand to answer any questions, all and all a good meeting. Facilitators are doing a good job. As a town we should reach out to see what the town can do to help.

**Councilperson McAuliffe-** Jerry attended the zoning meeting. They will be reopening Theresa's restaurant at some point. St. Mary's school has sold. There will be a block party in front of the church October 5<sup>th</sup>. This is also the start of the Capital Campaign to save the church. Jerry also went to Elhannon to see about the rescue dogs. They have pictures down there of all kinds of dogs to rescue. Jerry came home with a German Shepard.

**Councilperson Hanselman**-Bill attended the Zoning and Planning training with LaBerge. He feels that stipends for zoning and planning boards should be reviewed since we are starting a new budget cycle. Town of White Creek provided a structure of what they do for their members.

#### **New Business**

- West Hoosick Motocross Track- Supervisor Surdam gave the residents' time to speak. The residents still want to know what the board is doing to stop the track. The board has done all that they can do at this point by issuing the stop work order. Everything seems to have stopped. If they are using the track privately than this is permitted. One resident stated what about the Go Fund Me Page? This was reviewed and does not seem to have any more movement on it since the stop work order was issued. In order to bring them to court the board would need better evidence.
- Budget Transfers- Motion to approve 2019 budget transfers as requested.

- **2020 Budget**-This was reviewed in August. Just a reminder that the October meeting will be held on Tuesday, October 15.
- Truck & Equipment Lettering Resolution- Requires any new equipment to be lettered according to the resolution. Resolution #51 was created and passed. Motion was made by McAuliffe, Seconded by Hanselman. Roll call: Hanselman: Aye, McAuliffe: Aye, Surdam: Aye, Sheffer: Aye. Questions were raised by the Superintendent of Highways, Bill Shiland. He wanted clarification on equipment listed in the Resolution. He needed to make sure what equipment was to be lettered as it states all equipment in the resolution. Motion was made to revoke approval of Resolution #51 and rewrite what specific equipment was to be lettered. Motion was made by Hanselman to table to the next regular meeting. Sheffer seconded.
- Village Notice of Intent to Serve as Lead Agency for the Waste Water Treatment Plant
  (WWTP) Effluent Disinfection Project- a letter was received regarding the Village's intent to
  serve as lead agency for the Waste Water Treatment Plant. Everyone was in agreeance with
  this.
- Comp Alliance Letter- Member Loyalty Award Program- Supervisor Surdam received a letter regarding the Member Loyalty Award Program and where the event will be held this year.
- **New York Battery Energy Storage Systems**-This needs to be reviewed and a plan in place similar to the solar law. Jonathan will review and put together a law for review.

- Rensselaer County Legislature Fire Advisory Board- Supervisor Surdam has sent out emails to
  the local fire departments to see if anyone is interested in serving on the board. He is waiting
  to see if there is any response.
- Recyclers Permits- Supervisor Surdam states that Permits are due every two years and this is something that the all of our area recyclers have to apply for. Fran did get these out and gave them until Friday to respond
- Planning Board Reduction Law- this will be tabled until next month.
- Notice of Claim- This has been taken care of by NYMIR and will await the next step.

### **Old Business**

- **SAM Grant** We now ready to put this out to bid. Need to get the specifics and then this can be sent out. 28,000 in engineering fees have been paid.
- Zoning & Planning Board Training- All the board members that attended the training felt that
  the training was a good start for all members involved on the planning and zoning boards.
  This gives them something to work with. Checklists, flowcharts and what to do with simple
  subdivisions was just a few of the topics discussed. Will have to update the website with
  changes.
- **Teamsters Negotiations** Supervisor Surdam and Councilperson Sheffer met with the teamsters on the upcoming and renewal of the union contract. This is still work in progress.
- Combined TOH/Village of Hoosick Falls Woods Brook Grant Project- There is no update on the Woods Brook Project.
- Rte. 22 Rock Cut Parking Area- Can hear music playing down by the river. Loud enough to hear it as far away as hill road. Hoosac School can hear it as well.
- Mass Gathering review of the Law- 2<sup>nd</sup> Public hearing was held tonight before the Town Board Meeting. Motion to approve

- Updating our Town of Hoosick Employee Handbook & Policy/Procedure Manual- Ginny to begin working on for us. No Update
- On-Line Town Code- Jonathan has been emailing back and forth with the agency. Has not received an answer. He will follow up before the next meeting.
- **Retaining Employee Records Electronically-** We have the scanner just need to set up and start scanning. Supervisor Surdam to contact BAS to set up scanner.
- Updating Local Law #1 of 2008 for Building Code Fees- Board members to review and see
  what prices would be fair. Supervisor Surdam was not sure if the prices should mock the
  Village's or not. This will be discussed at our next meeting.
- Bathhouse Grant Update- We are still waiting on the required new survey from Weston & Sampson. It was told to Supervisor Surdam that he would have it by this time but received an email stating that there was a glitch and they were not able to get this completed.
- **Solar Law Revision** Jonathan has completed a draft of the changes. This has been sent to Planning and Zoning for review.

- Hoosick Post Office- No updates on the post office.
- **Greenway Grant for updating Comprehensive Plan-** This grant will be coming up soon. We are applying for a grant to assist with updating the Comprehensive Plan.
